List of social factors considered	Exclusion of companies with verified ongoing failure to respect established international norms. The core normative framework consists of the Prin- ciples of the UN Global Compact, the OECD Guidelines for Multinational Enterprises and the UN Guiding Principles for Business and Human Rights.



- > Exclusion of companies with verified ongoing involvement in the area of controversial weapons (including chemical, biological and nuclear weapons (both under and outside the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons), depleted uranium munitions, cluster munitions, and anti-personnel mines).
- > Exclusion of companies generating revenues (in proportion to their total revenues) >10% from For Profit Correction Facilities.
- > Exclusion of companies generating revenues (in proportion to their total revenues) >10% from Alcohol Production.
- > Exclusion of companies generating revenues (in proportion to their total revenues) >10% from Gambling Production.
- > Exclusion of companies generating revenues (in proportion to their total revenues) >10% from Tobacco Production.
- > Exclusion of companies generating revenues (in proportion to their total revenues) >10% from Pornography Production.

List of governance factors considered

Exclusion of companies with verified ongoing failure to respect established international norms. The core normative framework consists of the Principles of the UN Global Compact, the OECD Guidelines for Multinational Enterprises and the UN Guiding Principles for Business and Human Rights.

Data Input	The data used to construct the index is sourced externally from Institutional Shareholder Services Inc.
Verification and quality of data	The provider of ESG-related data input is selected by the Administrator based on an assessment of its existing processes in order to ensure the reliability and representativeness of the ESG-related data. The data provider has established processes in accordance with accepted and established market standards that ensure the permanent quality and reliability of the ESG-data provided.
